For the ACS Georgia local section, 2010 can be defined as a year of expanding our outreach and public relations efforts, building on recently-established events and activities, and developing relationships with new and different segments of our large and diverse membership.
	In executive committee evaluations and discussions over the last several years, it has been pointed out that the vast majority of our members are chemists in small to medium size companies, rather than the academics that typically populate the section leadership. In addition, the change in ACS membership structure has brought a large number of students (Atlanta has many institutions of higher learning) into our midst. In planning for this past year, the section made a deliberate effort to try to provide programming that would appeal to these untapped sectors of the membership. This programming began at the end of 2009 with a communications workshop, and continued in 2010. As the bread and butter of any local section, the monthly dinner meetings are often the site of first encounter for a newly active member. Consequently, the speakers (and locations) for this years meetings were chosen to attract these constituents. In particular, Mike Idacavage (April) addressed issues of sustainability (tied to CCED) in chemical industry, and John Lauterbach discussed establishing consulting businesses for unemployed chemists. The latter was also timely as the section had recently established a Chemistry Consultants group during 2010. In lieu of a November dinner meeting, the section sponsored two day-long programs, one aimed at professional development and linking unemployed chemists with local companies and a second designed to bring academic and industry researchers together in a spirit of collaboration and problem solving. Monthly meetings were also held to attract families with children (August's Floating Classroom boat ride), which continued a tradition begun in 2009, and students (December Holiday Party and Volunteer Fair), which began a new section tradition.
	During 2009 our section celebrated the 75th Herty Award, and created new outreach events (high school and college) to accompany it. One of the outcomes of this effort was our development of strong contacts within the multi-county educational systems, which has resulted in our participation this past year (2010) in dozens of career days, science fairs, and other outreach events in conjunction with National Lab Day, as well as improving on our already strong CCED and NCW programs. In addition, we have continued to refine the marketing and informational materials originally created over the past few years. The dual benefit of these activities has been our contact with thousands of students and teachers with positive public relations messages plus the volunteer opportunities that have brought additional section members (especially students) into active participation. While these members have been encouraged to affiliate as Chemistry Ambassadors, their active engagement is optimistic by itself. This was further confirmed by the turnout and response for our Holiday Party which served to reward and recognize active members and recruit new volunteers for section activities. These efforts should show additional benefits in 2011 as the section celebrates IYC using many of the same volunteers, educational contacts, and communication pathways.
